

The untimely death of Christopher Wilden at the age of 53 years, shook the whole community. Chris died in Hereford hospital after a short illness.

He was born in Dec. 1962 as the second son to Gordon (John) and Joyce Wilden. He went to Much Birch School under the tutelege of the late Noel Lewis and then on to Haywood High School. On leaving, Haywood, he was apprenticed to William Powell, the builders. He was already prepared for the building trade as he and Michael, his older brother, helped out the late Jack Cox, who built a number of houses and bungalows on nearby plots. What it did show was that he was very skilful with his hands and was also good at maths. He developed an interest in motor bikes and cars from an early age and was very knowledgeable about engines and performance. His first car. a 3 wheeler car of the 'Fools and Horses' type tipped over very easily round the twisty lanes of Little Birch and many week ends were spent with plastic filler and repairs made to 'go off' again. As he earned more money, he liked more sporty cars, the Escort RS2000 was his favourite. However, even that car had some close encounters with hedges and ditches over the years.

Having worked for William Powell's in the 80's and into the 90's, he then took a more lucrative job near Ashford in Kent near to where the Channel Tunnel emerged. He would work 5 days a week living in a caravan and would return to Herefordshire at the week ends and spend his money on the fast car. In the mid 1990's he met Deborah and they were later married. in due time they were blessed with 2 children, Daniel and Olivia.

Unfortunately, the relationship did not flourish and they went their separate ways with Chris having the children. About this time, Chris broke his ankle which seemed to trigger a downward spiral for Chris and he never recovered that zest for life. He moved back to 'Austena' with his parents and just seemed to retreat into himself. Sadly his father died some two and a half years ago but Chris looked after his mother, Joyce, extremely well until a few weeks before he died.

His funeral took place at Hereford Crematorium on Friday, 11th November and was conducted by Rev. Mark Johnson. Chris's daughter Olivia read a poem and rev. Mark gave the tribute, from which these notes are duly acknowledged. Donations in memory of Chris were made to Much Birch Surgery. He will be sadly missed by a wide circle of friends and we send to Joyce, Daniel and Olivia, together with brother Michael and sister Heather and their families our sincere sympathies.

We are also sad to report the death of Ian Day of Tump Lane who died in the County Hospital after a short illness and we send our sincere condolences to wife, Wendy, son Joshua and his family and to daughter, Sophia. Ian was only in his mid-fifties.

The death of Patricia Boswell also late of Tump Lane and Much Dewchurch has also been announced. We send to husband, Dave, and to daughter, Wanda, and son, Carl our sincere condolences.

We say a 'big Thank you' to Saul Jones who has delivered this Newsletter to 11 properties on the lower half of the Barrack Hill for many years and wish him well in the future.



All for Freedom - A True story of escape from the Nazis Paperback – published 10 Nov 2016

by <u>D.T.A. Davies</u> (Author), <u>Ioan Wyn Evans</u> (Author)

DT. Davies witnessed Nazi atrocities at first hand. Serving with the Royal Artillery, he was originally captured after the Battle of Crete in 1941. He spent three years as a prisoner of war, in Austria, then Hungary and finally at the barbaric concentration camp of Zemun, near Belgrade. These places were far removed from the rural Carmarthenshire where he was brought up, but their stench remains with him to this day. DT was awarded the Military Medal for his wartime service, but this account is no war film screenplay. There is no caricaturing or glamorizing, merely the faithful recording of events which still disturb and defy belief over 70 years on, but which also testify to the heroic resilience of the human spirit even in its darkest hours

Report on the Dedication of Wormelow's War Memorial

At the Rosemary Rigby Green on the 11th November, the Revd Mark Johnson dedicated a Liquid Amber Tree as Wormelow's official War Memorial. Until the dedication, Wormelow had no official war memorial, although funds collected after the First World War did finance the clock at Much Birch Church. After a request by Rosemary Rigby MBE, Much Birch Parish Council ratified the tree as the official War Memorial just a few weeks ago, and it is now on the National War Memorial list.

The Liquid Amber tree was planted in 2014, in the pouring rain, by pupils from Much Birch C of E Primary School. Each pupil present added a teaspoon of soil as part of the official ceremony. This year, at 11 a.m. and as the sun shone on the dedication service, the last post was sounded and a number of wreathes laid. Mike Lovelock, chair of St Weonards Royal British Legion, Miss Bea Morris of the War Memorial Trust, Trevor Forrester of the Pilgrim Hotel and Roger Sweetman all stepped forward and laid wreathes, finally two Year 6 children from the school laid their wreath. Small crosses were also placed next to the tree.

Some of the children recite poetry they had written especially for the day to reflect their view of the Great War one hundred years on. All the children present received a Violette Szabo postcard by Miss Rigby, as a lasting reminder of courage in times of war and a memento of the inaugural day. Leaving the field all the children and guests were treated to warm drinks and home made biscuits by Trevor Forrester of the Pilgrim Hotel, Trever is a former RAF serviceman who spent time in Afghanistan.

All parents know that those years before children go off to school and then college are vital in a child's life and having a good start at home is of utmost importance – but we also know things don't run smoothly all the time.

Home-Start Herefordshire believes parents have the key role in creating a secure childhood for their children. It's just sometimes they need a bit of help...your help, could make the difference.

Reasons for giving support are varied: Isolation, Domestic abuse, multiple births, child's behaviour, School attainment, mental illness, self esteem, disability and many more.

Last year we supported 208 Herefordshire families. This would not have been possible without the help of our home-visiting volunteers.

These wonderful people visit families at home, giving support to help them overcome a multitude of difficult situations. Our volunteers tend to be parents or have parenting experience. We have male and female volunteers of all ages and from all backgrounds. Some choose to train to volunteer as mentors and others may be experienced in specific fields and offer their support in different ways. All making the commitment to guide and support a family through their troubled time

Before they are matched with a family, an initial recruitment policy is adhered to. All new prospective volunteers attend a course of preparation, have an enhanced criminal records check, and references to support their application.

We now recruiting for our New Year course that starts on the 26th January it will run every Thursday for 10 weeks 9.30 - 2.50

Volunteers give 2-3 hours a week to visit a family. In return our volunteers find that they have fun, feel rewarded and honoured that they are allowed into the life of a family. Our volunteers are given excellent training and support, a chance to join in with our social events and all out of pocket expenses are paid.

Make a Will, Make a Difference Will Writing Fortnight 2017

Education, employment and empowerment

We all know we should make a Will. But how many of us put off doing so without realising the implications for those we will leave behind? Making preparations in your lifetime about what should happen to your possessions or assets after you die may save your loved ones difficulties and cost in the future. Young people, as well as those of more advanced years, can make their wishes very clear by writing a Will.

In partnership with the Royal National College for the Blind (RNC), two solicitors firms are offering to help local people get their affairs in order whilst also supporting the College's work with people who are blind and partially sighted.

From 6th to 17th March 2017, Chartered Legal Executive, Sally Smith of Harrison Clark Rickerbys Solicitors, Hereford (01432 349670) and Adrian Jones, Paralegal at Gabbs Solicitors, Leominster (01568 616333) are offering to waive their Will writing fee in exchange for a donation to RNC. This opportunity relates to basic Wills i.e. where the instructions outlined in the Will are not complex.

The suggested donation is £95 for a basic single Will and £150 for basic mirror Wills. The money raised will give students at the RNC the chance to live independently and the opportunity to prepare for university or the workplace. Demand is likely to be high so booking an appointment for Will Writing Fortnight as early as possible with one of the two participating solicitors is recommended.





Your Little Birch Parish Council Councillors are:-

At the November meeting of Little Birch Parish Council, Mrs Jane Rigler came to tell the meeting about the OWL Good Neighbour scheme. This is a way to link volunteers with people who might need a hand doing things such as gardening, getting to the shops, getting some basic DIY done in their homes. OWL try to link the volunteers' skills with the needs of the people asking for assistance, and it is working well in the Garway area. If people in Much Birch, Little Birch or Aconbury are interested in finding out more about this scheme, please ring the clerk, Sophie, in the first instance.

The Little Birch and Aconbury Neighbourhood Planning steering group have now both delivered and collected from you your questionnaires, and thank you so much, we had an amazingly high return rate, with over 70% of the questionnaires being completed and returned to us. Perhaps it was the incentive of the £50 voucher for a meal at The Castle for questionnaires completed and returned to the steering group on time, this was won by Iana Collinson from Little Birch, and we hope that she has a lovely meal!

Other news is that the PC voted to have their meetings every month for a trial period of six months. The Councillors felt that with the Neighbourhood Plan progressing so well, and an increasing number of planning applications for them to consider, that monthly meetings might now be necessary. Members of the public are, as ever, invited to attend these meetings which happen on the first Wednesday of each month, and agendas are put on our web site and on the parish boards five days before hand.

The Parish Council and Little Birch Village Hall committee are now in the process of purchasing a defibrillator which will live on the outside wall of the Village Hall. We hope that we will have a training session on how to use it early in the new year – details will be on the parish notice board.

Finally, at this meeting, the Parish Council heard that Herefordshire Council were reducing the amount of money that they were putting into the lengthsmans services to 25% of the funds that are currently available. This means that should the parish wish to continue with the excellent work that has been done over the last 8 years to put in order the drainage gullies beside our lanes, clear the drains and generally help to maintain the parish, then we will need to fund it ourselves. To this end, the PC voted to absorb some of the costs expected in 2017/18 from our reserves, and they unanimously to increase the parish precept to £4,500 which is an increase of 12% from last year. The precept this year works out to be £24.19 per year per person on the Little Birch electoral role.




